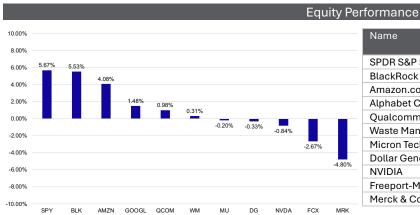

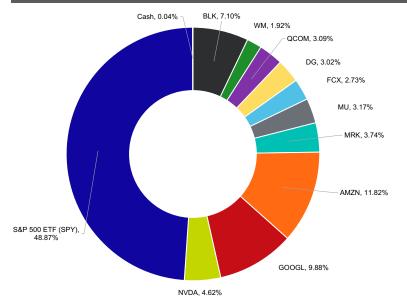

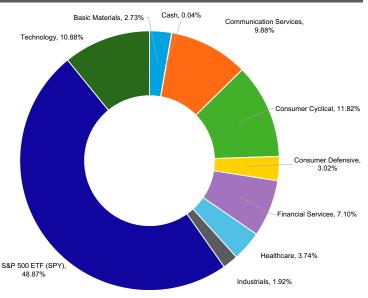

#### **Best Performer**

**Thesis:** BlackRock's brand and scale make it a market leader in ETFs and passive investment funds.

- BlackRock holds a dominant position in the asset management industry, ensuring a steady flow of assets under management and economies of scale that protect margins despite industry fee compression.
- BlackRock benefits from a well-diversified revenue mix, including asset management fees, performance fees, and technology services driven by its Aladdin platform. This helps insulate the firm from cyclical fluctuations in investment flows.
- BlackRock maintains conservative leverage levels and demonstrates effective risk management practices. BlackRock has the ability to adapt to economic shifts, such as rising interest rates or market volatility.
- With a strong focus on ESG investments, BlackRock can capture an increasing demand for sustainable products.
   Additionally, BlackRock has expanded into emerging markets to capture growth in these economies.

### Worst Performer

**Thesis:** Merck has a strong position in the pharmaceutical industry, with its flagship cancer drug, Keytruda.

- Merck's stock has decline from its peak earlier in 2024, which is related to the impact of a one-time charge following the company's acquisition of Eyebiotech, Ltd. However, the company's fundamentals haven't changed.
- Keytruda is a leading drug in immuno-oncology and has seen significant revenue growth.
- An aging population and rising healthcare spending provide tailwinds for the pharmaceutical industry.
- Merck's substantial cash flows allow it to invest heavily in R&D.
  This positions the company to continue delivering innovative drugs.
- Compared to key competitors such as Eli Lilly and AstraZeneca, Merck's P/E ratio of 20.37 indicates that the stock is potentially undervalued.
